Prayer #2

Reader #10: That all who have suffered as a result of these natural disasters may heal; that individuals, families, communities, and nations may be restored to peace and a viable future,

Reader #11: That growing understanding among faithful peoples will lead to a shared vision of justice and peace,

D. Prayer Service For an Elementary School
