They are to overcome their individualism and discover, in the light of faith, their specific vocation to live responsibly in a community with others. The very pattern of the Christian life draws them to commit themselves to serve God in their [brothers and sisters] and to make the world a better place for [humankind] to live in.

Sharing in the Church's Evangelizing Mission


